Welcome

Mary Vazquez – United Way of Greater Houston

Hello! Thank you for joining us. Today, we will receive COVID updates from the county, United Way, and Fort Bend Recovers Workgroups. There will also be an opportunity for agencies to provide updates.

COVID 19 Updates

Caroline Egan – Fort Bend Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Management

- In early May, Fort Bend's positivity rate was 2-3 percent. Currently it is around 12 percent. This number is derived from positive results at Fort Bend County/Access Health testing sites.
- The Smart Financial Center, Marshall High School, Gallery Furniture, Seven Lakes Junior High School, and the Fair Ground testing sites are still operating. Each site is testing upward of 1,000 people per day. Consequently, there has been a delay in receiving test results. It is now taking an average of 7 days to get results back. Note, that test sites may close early due to the heat index. We want to make sure that those administering test are safe and well.
- The Texas State Guard will be operating the Fair Ground testing site through July 15th. It is open 7 days a week. All scheduling for this site is online only. The other sites will be operational through the end of July.
- Health and Human Services and Access Health is offering temporary pop up sites. This week
 there is a focus on offering services in the Arcola/Fresno area. We are not heavily advertising
 these sites because we want to make sure testing is available for individuals that reside in the
 area. Flyers have been sent to the local government and agencies in that area. Access Health has
 set up a separate line to accommodate appointments for this pop-up site.
- Last week the Commissioner's Court voted to extend Fort Bend County's Disaster declaration through the end of July.
- The Governor issued an order for all individuals to wear masks while in public. Exceptions to the rule can be found in the order listing.
- The Mortgage/Rent/Utility Assistance Program will open on July 20th. Applications can be submitted on www.Fortbendcounty.tx.gov



County hospitals are full. They are working on plans to free up bed space. Additionally, EMS call volume has increased. From June – July 4th of 2019 the EMS department was averaging between 85-90 cases a day. Through the same time frame this year they are averaging about 110 calls a day.

Mary Vazquez – United Way of Greater Houston

- To date 211 has answered about 127,000 calls related to COVID in our 4-county service area.
 - o 7,210 calls have been answered in Fort Bend County.
 - o 3,000 of those calls are for rent assistance.
 - o 2400 for utility assistance
 - o 1400 for testing site information
- There is a new tool called Flood Factor that has updated information on your flood risk. It rates
 your home's risk of flooding on a scale from 1-10. It is a great tool to utilize. The website to view
 your flood risk is www.floodfactor.com
- TranStar has new information about roadway flood risks that they want to get out to the public. For additional information please reference the FBR communication sent out on ??
- Attack Poverty is having internet connectivity issues, so they are not on the call. They are
 continuing to move forward with the county wide financial assistance. Food distribution
 continues with updated USDA regulations. If you have any questions reach out to Elise Kauffman
 or Brandon Baca.
